SCRIPTURE READINGS

Epistle – 2 Corinthians 1:21-2:4

²¹ Now he which establisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us, is God,²² Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts.²³ Moreover I call God for a record upon my soul, that to spare you I came not as yet unto Corinth.²⁴ Not for that we have dominion over your faith, but are helpers of your joy: for by faith ye stand. ^{2:1} But I determined this with myself, that I would not come again to you in heaviness.² For if I make you sorry, who is he then that maketh me glad, but the same which is made sorry by me?³ And I wrote this same unto you, lest, when I came, I should have sorrow from them of whom I ought to rejoice; having confidence in you all, that my joy is the joy of you all.⁴ For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote unto you with many tears; not that ye should be grieved, but that ye might know the love which I have more abundantly unto you.

Gospel – Matthew 22:1-14

¹ And Jesus answered and spake unto them again by parables, and said, ²The kingdom of heaven is like unto a certain king, which made a marriage for his son, ³ And sent forth his servants to call them that were bidden to the wedding: and they would not come. ⁴ Again, he sent forth other servants, saying, Tell them which are bidden, Behold, I have prepared my dinner: my oxen and my fatlings are killed, and all things are ready: come unto the marriage. ⁵ But they made light of it, and went their ways, one to his farm, another to his merchandise: ⁶ And the remnant took his servants, and entreated them spitefully, and slew them. ⁷ But when the king heard thereof, he was wroth: and he sent forth his armies, and destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. ⁸ Then saith he to his servants, The wedding is ready, but they which were bidden were not worthy. ⁹ Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as ye shall find, bid to the marriage. ¹⁰ So those servants went out into the highways, and gathered together all as many as they found, both bad and good: and the wedding was furnished with guests. ¹¹ And when the king came in to see the guests, he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment: ¹² And he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment? And he was speechless. ¹³ Then said the king to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast him into outer darkness, there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Patristic Commentary

“There is a great difference, dearly beloved brethren, between corporal and spiritual delights in that the former, when we are without them, enkindle in the soul a strong desire to possess them, but once they are attained, they quickly satiate us. Spiritual pleasures, on the contrary, when unattained, produce a certain aversion; but once we taste them, the taste awakens desire, and our hunger for them increases the more we taste them... So we see that, if we do not taste these delights, we cannot desire them, because their flavor is unknown to us... so that the psalmist says, ‘Taste and see that the Lord is sweet’ (Ps. 33:9). We do not know what we should desire, and our repugnance is increased the further our souls stray from that true nourishment...”
